# The Association

## Looking out for the quality of life in our central London oasis

We are lucky to live in an area with such a strong sense of community and where so many people are actively working to preserve and promote the pleasures of living here. The HDRA contributes to that sense of community by engaging with residents and businesses in the area and championing our shared interests on many fronts. It is a local residents' association born out of the desire to promote and sustain a formally recognised conservation area. To make this a practical reality, the HDRA Committee, a small team of resident volunteers drawn from Harrowby, Molyneux, Shouldham, Cato and Brendon Streets plus Crawford Place takes an interest in, and will - where necessary - act upon, on planning and licensing applications, traffic proposals including cycleways and speed limits, rubbish collections and fly-tipping, all forms of anti-social behaviour and the impacts of crime on our streets .... to name just a few issues. We also keep residents informed of developments and consultations in and around our area and provide a channel of online communication that helps test the strength of feeling about local issues and determine our priorities. Simply by joining HDRA, you are contributing to the positive influence and impact local residents have on this special neighbourhood.

# What do you get as a member ?

## A much stronger say

As a recognised Westminster amenity society, HDRA is able to put the residents' voice front and centre in its direct and regular contacts with Westminster City Council, Ward Councillors, The Metropolitan Police and our Member of Parliament as well as take an active role in other established fora and groups such as the Marylebone Association, Westminster Amenity Societies Forum and Marylebone Neighbourhood Forum.

We also support schemes to beautify our area, such as the hanging baskets provided in association with Westminster Council in Shouldham Street and Molyneux Street.

## News and views

Regular emails with reporting on the big issues affecting the area using our members email network. Our web site, [www.hdragroup.org](http://www.hdragroup.org) is a useful hub for local information. Amongst other things it maintains a list of recommended local tradesmen and links to major local services, relevant planning and licensing issues and so on.

## Public meetings and events

We generally hold two public events each year, where you can hear reports of our activities, listen to invited speakers on local topics, discuss priorities, listen and talk to Westminster Councillors and the police, and socialise. We have also held large events – a commemoration of the Cato Street conspiracy and street parties for Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee and for King Charles' Coronation. We are also planning to host more frequent informal social events.

## An email network for members

Have you got something to sell ? A favour to ask ? Perhaps a local issue that affects you that you would like to air ? Chimney sweeps and plumbers have been recommended a viola loaned and countless household items exchanged via our dedicated, private email group for members.

## Meet your neighbours

We are a very sociable association — joining is a very good way to get to know your neighbours, an especial privilege of living in our oasis in the centre of a very busy city.
